

INSTRUMENT OF GOVERNMENT

1. The name of the school is Pollington Balne Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School.
2. Recognising its historic foundation, the school will preserve and develop its religious character in accordance with the principles of the Church of England and in partnership with the Church at parish and diocesan level.

The school aims to serve its community by providing an education of the highest quality within the context of Christian belief and practice. It encourages an understanding of the meaning and significance of faith, and promotes Christian values through the experience it offers to all its pupils.

3. The school is a voluntary aided school.
4. The name of the governing body is The Governing Body of Pollington Balne Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School.
5. The governing body shall consist of:
 - 2 Parent governors;
 - 1 Local Authority governor;
 - 1 Headteacher governor;
 - 1 Elected staff governors;
 - 8 Foundation governors;
 - 1 Co-opted governor.
6. The total number of governors is 14.
7. The foundation governors of the school shall comprise:

(a) One ex officio governor being, subject to paragraph (8), the principal officiating minister means:

- (i) if the school is for the time being situated in an ecclesiastical parish the rector or vicar of the parish, or in the case of a team ministry the team rector; or
- (ii) if the ecclesiastical parish has no rector or vicar, the priest in charge thereof; or
- (iii) if the school is for the time being situated in a conventional district, the curate in charge.

- (b) One appointed by the Sheffield Diocesan Board of Education;
 - (c) 5 nominated by the Parochial Church Council for Great Snaith and appointed by the Diocesan Board of Education, at least 2 of whom shall, at the time of their appointment, be eligible for appointment as parent governors.
- 8. If the principal officiating minister for the time being:
 - a) elects not to be an ex-officio governor, by notice in writing to the clerk to the governing body and to the Archdeacon of the Archdeaconry within which the school is situated; or
 - b) without the consent of the said Archdeacon has failed to attend meetings of the governing body for a continuous period of six months beginning with the date of a meeting; or
 - c) is disqualified from acting as an ex-officio governor, or if there is for the time being a vacancy of the benefice, then the said Archdeacon may, by notice in writing given to the clerk to the governing body and (except in the case of a vacancy) to the minister, specify a person to act as a substitute for the minister: and the person so specified shall be the ex-officio governors (for the purposes of paragraph (7a) for such a period as the Archdeacon may from time to time specify).
- 9. The said Archdeacon may under regulation 23(2) of the regulations, remove the ex-officio foundation governor and appoint any substitute governor.
- 10. The trust deed for the school cannot be traced.
- 11. This Instrument of Government comes into effect: 1st January, 2015.
- 12. This Instrument was made by order of the East Riding of Yorkshire Local Education Authority on 23rd December, 2014.
- 13. A copy of the instrument must be supplied to every member of the governing body and the trustees under any trust deed and to the appropriate religious body.
