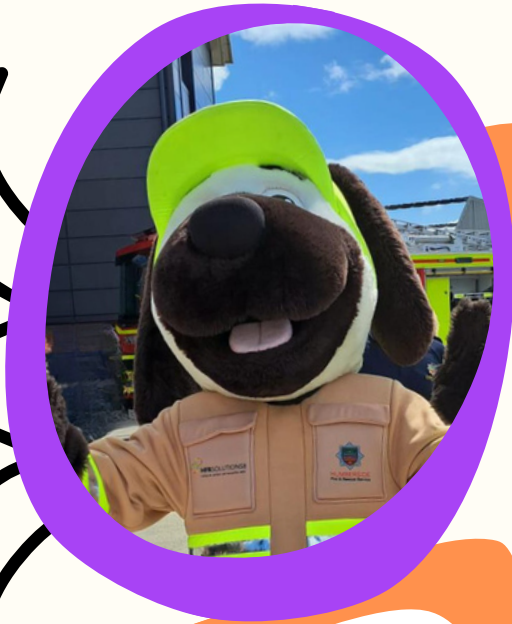
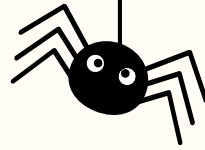

I'm Frankie Fire Dog, and I want to remind you Halloween is a fun night for many, but without care it can quickly turn risky. Whether it's costumes, candles, or trick-or-treating, a little preparation goes a long way.

REMEMBER

Make sure you're easy to see by wearing something bright or reflective. Always walk on pavements, stay with your group and cross roads carefully using proper crossings. Drivers might not see you easily, especially in the dark.

If you're going out without an adult, make sure you're with at least two friends. Take a torch to help you see and be seen, and carry a charged phone if you have one. Stick to the route you've agreed with your grown-up, and let them know if you plan to go a different way. Try to avoid crossing busy roads or railway tracks whenever you can.

WHEN TRICK-OR-TREATING

Only visit homes that are well-lit and decorated and never go inside a stranger's house. Avoid knocking on doors of older or vulnerable people, as they may not enjoy Halloween festivities. Stick to visiting friends, family, or nearby neighbours, and be cautious around open flames like candles on doorsteps. If your costume catches fire, remember to STOP, DROP and ROLL.
