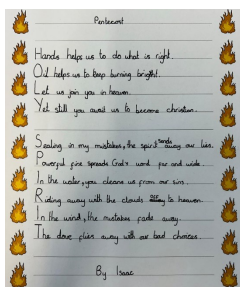
## Maple Class
